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## An Overview of Lodhran Pilot Project

Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) is Established in 1999. LPP is a not-for-profit organization committed to promote development and humanitarian objectives in Pakistan. It is governed by an independent board, which makes sure that it works in a non-partisan manner and contributes to the development of all disadvantaged communities without any discrimination on religious or political considerations. It is registered under the Societies Act 1860. Certified by Pakistan Center for Philanthropy, LPP manages a diverse range of programs and partnerships, and is widely recognized as one of the leading NGOs in the community development sector in Pakistan. The foundation of LPP was laid to create a healthy, hygienic and human friendly environment in rural and semi-urban areas of the Southern Punjab. The first sanitation project was initiated in Lodhran during 1999, following the footsteps of the great Akhtar Hameed Khan in Orangi Pilot project (OPP), the renowned social scientist, with the support of the local communities facilitating the Government of Punjab.

## Our Work under Thematic Areas

“The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, adopted by all United Nations Member States in 2015, provides a shared blueprint for peace and prosperity for people and the planet, now and into the future. At its heart are the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), which are an urgent call for action by all countries - developed and developing - in a global partnership. They recognize that ending poverty and other deprivations must go hand-in-hand with strategies that improve health and education, reduce inequality, and spur economic growth – all while tackling climate change and working to preserve our oceans and forests”. Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP), contributed in 8 SDGs with the collaboration of its donors, funding partners, Corporate Social Responsibilities (CSR) and other stakeholders under its policies, procedures & programs under National & Provincial commitments.

Under Livelihood/ Skill Development program, LPP implemented 04 projects and contributed in eradication of extreme poverty, especially for the people living in poor conditions, establishing 21 training centers and providing 828 women in garments sector. Increasing the production abilities from livestock and adaptation of high value crops (zinc fortified wheat), increasing the resilience to COVID-19 like disasters, LPP mobilized the resources from donors & market actors to contribute in ending the poverty in its different dimensions.

To contribute in ending the discriminations against women and girls at community level, LPP established a toll-free number, developed referral directories and created opportunities to enhance their role as active citizen, adopting the inclusive approaches, citizen engagements, referrals, Early Warning System (ERS)/Early Response Mechanism (ERM), structure

establishment & meetings for support and coordination. With the right based approach, LPP raised awareness, established forums & settled referral mechanism to minimize all harmful practices, such as early and forced marriages through forums, meetings and publications.

"Under WASH & Health program, LPP implemented 02 projects (funded & core) and contributed in SDG 06, achieving universal and equitable access to safe and affordable drinking water through Afridive Hand Pumps, RO Plants, achieved access to adequate and equitable sanitation and hygiene, paying special attention to the needs of women and girls and those in vulnerable situations and supported and strengthened the participation of local communities in WASH services through formation & strengthening community & Govt. institutions e.g. Village WASH Committees, Youth Groups, Women Support Groups, School WASH Clubs. Under Health Sub thematic area, LPP responded to combat COVID-19 and installing Hand Washing Stations, providing COVID-19 Supplies (hand sanitizers, soap & masks and provision of Sanitation facilities. The COVID-19 response remained the integrated to all projects.

"Under Peace, Sports & Culture programs, LPP implemented 03 projects for the promotion of peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at different levels (SDG 16). For the promotion of rules of law, LPP organized Trainings on Village Panchayat and Neighborhood Councils Act 2019, Punjab Transparency and Right to Information 2013, Gender Mainstreaming and Women Empowerment, Minority Rights and Orientation on Baldia App and Leadership & Social Skills. LPP ensured the inclusive, participatory and representative decision-making approaches.

## Executive Summary

Keeping in view the organization vision and mission Lodhran Pilot Project LPP keep sustained milestone achieving in the year 2021. Successful implementation of programs and projects with the support of CSR and donor findings in the 07 Districts of Punjab Province. Through the implementation of programs and projects, AAWAZ-II, ASWA-II, Capacity Building Interventions, Citizen Engagement Digital Model, Civil Society Organization CSO's BRIDGE Program, Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Partnerships Programs, Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition-GAIN, Let Peace Prevail-II, Making Peace Clubs and Student Societies Sustainable, Skills for Market Linkages (SFML) Round-II and COVID-19 Response, Lodhran Pilot Project LPP contributed in livelihood, Health, women empowerment, Water Sanitation and Hygiene, Peace Building through Sport & Culture and Climate Change. We achieved sustainable results in community behaviors, particularly in improved sanitation practices, preventive health, animal husbandry practices, inclusion of vulnerable and marginalized groups of societies, gender mainstreaming, and creating peace and harmony at community and institution level. We got success to empower women through their dignified and work/earning skills and become a supportive member of their families. LPP achieved the goal of community sensitization regarding, child rights, early and forced marriages and child labor. By the initiatives of LPP, Formation & Activation of District lawyers' group was made. LPP widened its outreach to another province Sindh. Honey bee harvesting and Helpline projects were launched as the pilot and completed many learning to impart in future programs. Quality checks and control were also remained fully functional to ensure quality of work and maximize the community benefits in developmental changes. As Complaints & Response Mechanism CRM and internal audits extended their due support to make sure the quality intervention in the target areas. Staff capacity building and work proficiency was the main focus while allocation of responsibilities. Support functions were enhancing their skills and capacities for timely and best possible facilitation for the projects and program execution adopting innovative & modern technologies e.g., TimeTrax, regarding Human Resource Department. LPP kept its best coordination and Liaisoning with Govt. departments for smooth implementation of projects and program along with facilitation and provision of intellectual input regarding climate change in District Lodhran and Jhang. Moreover, facilitated local Govt. department regarding low-cost sanitation at Lala Mousa Academy. LPP Established urban forest with close coordination of main University of South Punjab, the Bahauddin Zakariya University–BZU, Multan. In 2021 organization's top management kept approaching and attracting different donor agencies continue, to acquire more funds for the wellbeing of vulnerable and marginalized communities.




## Goal 1. End poverty in all its forms everywhere

### Skills for Market Linkages (SFML-Round-II)

The trainings on “Commercial Tailoring & Adda Work”, “Commercial Tailoring & Hand Embroidery” and development of “Skills for Market Linkages”, contributed in the reduction of poverty in District Dera Ghazi Khan & Faisal Abad. The project interventions increased the access of low income, poor and vulnerable members of society through vocational training and skills acquisition programs in Punjab so that they can earn higher incomes.

- ✓ 872 female trainees are skilled with Commercial Tailoring, Adda Work & Hand Embroidery”.
- ✓ The female trainees are linked with local & regional market, obtaining the skills for market linkages
- ✓ The trainees have met the assessment compliance and obtained training course completion certificates. There are 21 training centers established (13 in Dera Ghazi Khan & 08 in Faisal Abad) for 872 trainees (550 Dera Ghazi Khan & 322 Faisal Abad) had demonstrable poor socio-economic conditions, Unemployed, Low Family Income and Zakat Eligible, acquiring the 21 skilled, well trained experienced and diploma holder trainers in 40 classes (*for details see below graph, please*).

### Sustainable segregation of Zinc wheat from farmers to millers (GAIN Project)

Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) developed a mechanism of sustainable segregation of Zinc wheat from farmers to millers and as separate product (Zinc Wheat Flour) and created sustainable linkages among the value chain actors for Zinc Wheat grain. LPP developed the capacity of the value chain actors (e.g., Support in Food Packaging Development & Production) to increase supply of the Zinc Biofortified Wheat flour as Commercialization strategy and implementation.



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## Key Out Puts

- ✓ Farmers started the sowing, harvesting, and marketing of zinc fortified wheat by the coordination, mobilization, organization and counselling of LPP.
- ✓ A mechanism of regular coordination meetings of farmers & relevant stakeholder is established.
- ✓ 200 progressive farmers (having more than 25 acre) and 3100 semi subsistence farmers (less than 10 acre), who are interested in the Zinc Wheat growing are identified (31000 persons, estimated).
- ✓ Created demand of Zinc Biofortified Wheat flour & facilitated for the provision of orders to all farmers & market actors on monthly basis through vendors.
- ✓ Farmers have started the exchange of non-Zinc Biofortified Wheat to the Zinc Biofortified Wheat flour.



## Contribution of LPP to the Improvement of Animal Husbandry Practices, Business Model Initiatives (Honey Bee Farming) and Help Line (CSR).

LPP worked on Behavior Change, Extension Activities, Agriculture Activities, Honey Bee Farming and Facilitated for Akhuwat Loan for the contribution of the Improvement of Animal Husbandry Practices. With the technical support of WWF, LPP successfully piloted the Honey Bee Farming.

### Key Out Puts of Animal Husbandry

- ✓ 26 farmers adopted the practices of fencing, untying & free access to water
- ✓ The milk production & income of 23 farmers is increased adopting the Improved Animal Husbandry Practices.
- ✓ 23 farmers grouped their farms by age, pregnancy & milking, adopting the Improved Animal Husbandry Practices
- ✓ 20 farmers started to make Mastitis Dip, adopting hygienic measures at their farms.
- ✓ 200 farmers are vaccinating their animals & deworming them regularly.
- ✓ 01 farmer installed chiller at his farm for formal milk chain supply for more than 30 milk producers & Nestle & Engro Foods



- ✓ 153 men & women farmers are guided about the benefits of fencing, untying & free access to water, developing their plans according to their resources about adaptation of improved animal husbandry practices through 35 Community meetings round the year in 08 registered villages.
- ✓ 98 male & female farmers were sensitized about Livestock & Dairy Development and aware of quality Seed & Wanda, Fodder Planning during 03 Farmer Field Days.
- ✓ 227 men & women farmers were educated about the diseases, nutrition requirement, calf management & gross margin calculation through 13 groups discussion.
- ✓ 60 families improved their nutrition, producing nutritious & diversified vegetables during summer & winter seasons through provision of seeds & sessions on Kitchen gardening, benefits & methods organic food production.
- ✓ Farmers were introduced with demo wheat plot, the scheme of Govt. about Akbar-19.
- ✓ 2200 mounds 'zinc fortified wheat' was produced by the farmers under the facilitation of LPP, harvesting 50 acre of Akbar-19 wheat verity.


- ✓ Piloting the Honey Bee Harvesting, 04 families & 01 group of transgenders were trained, got exposure & facilitated with honey bee boxes. As the result, 03 new boxes were produced from the existing boxes and harvested 6.5 KG of Honey from the 7 sheets.
- ✓ 05 group of needy females (3 females in each group) were identified & facilitated throughout the registration process of Akhuwat interest free loan.




### Goal 3. Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages



#### Emergency Response to the COVID-19 in 2021

During the pandemic of COVID-19, LPP adopted protective measures at entrance & exit points of offices & working areas e.g., the availability of thermal guns, maintenance of Log / record of temperature, Hand Hygiene e.g., the availability of hand sanitizer/washing facilities, Respiratory Hygiene e.g., the availability of face masks) and Social/ Physical Hygiene e.g., maintaining six feet diameter distancing. LPP ensured the disinfection work premises & equipment's ensuring the availability of disinfection material and equipment. LPP ensured Social Awareness, displaying COVID-19 preventive measures, physical hygiene & disinfection of premises.



Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) contributed to minimize the suffering of COVID-19 affected communities, responding the people at risks, providing Hand Washing Stations, COVID-19 Supplies, Vaccination & Provision Sanitation Facilities and raising awareness about COVID-19 in Bahawalpur, Lodhran, Multan, Jhang Districts by its Emergency Response Teams (ERTs).

LPP raised voices to achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls, focusing the gender base violence, child labor and early & forced marriages. It worked on behavior change at community level regarding their role as active citizen, citizen engagements, referrals, Early Warning System (ERS)/Early Response Mechanism (ERM), structure establishment & meetings for support and coordination.

LPP Raised awareness, provided the services, supported through referrals, established inclusive forums to achieve gender equality and empowered women, girls, minorities, transgenders & other marginalized segments.



- ✓ Individuals accessed the services 903 (478 Male, 424 Female, 98 Minority and 6 PWDs)
- ✓ 718 (409 Male, 309 female, 05 PWDs and 05 Minority) received Early Warning Early warning and response system
- ✓ 174 Conflicts pre-empted on issues like gender-based violence, child labor and community disputes


## Goal 6. Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all (ASWA-II)

Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) accelerated the Sanitation & Water (ASWA-II) for all to contribute to the improve of health, nutrition and well-being of poor and vulnerable people in District Jhang, especially of women and girls. Its thematic contribution is as below:

**Sanitation & Hygiene:** 63,000 people (men, women, boys, girls, PWDs) gain sustained access to basic sanitation, disaggregated by sex and disability. Additional 33 (cumulative 214) villages in tehsil 18- Hazari and Ahmad Pur Sial certified by ODF Committee and sustain the ODF status. Additionally, people (men, women, boys, girls, PWDs) gain sustained access to basic handwashing facilities, disaggregated by sex and disability.

**Water Supply:** 185 Villages WASH Committees/Operations and Maintenance Committees Supported in water safety planning, strengthening maintenance system to ensure sustained access to basic & safe water supplies.

**WASH in Institutions:** 60 Schools Councils and 25 Health Care Facilities Management Committees are strengthened to promote sustained WASH services and behaviors.


### Support and strengthening for the participation local communities in improving water and sanitation management

### Increased access to safe drinking water with interventions of Hand Pump, Bio-Sand Water Filters and RO Plants

By the LPP, 1090 families got access to safe drinking water through 85 functional hand pumps (850 families) and 24 functional Bio Sand Water Filter Plants (240 families) with operation & maintenance services by LPP & Community. In addition, Operation & Maintenance Services were provided to the functionality of 03 Reverse Osmoses (RO) Plants for more than 20,000 persons East West Bazar Gellay Wal, replacing the RO membrane.




### Clean & Green Lodhran

To keep Lodhran, Clean & Green, LPP planted 141878 plants in Spring season (56960) & Monsoon Seasons (84,918) by the close coordination with District Administration. As the result of Clean Green Initiatives, Deputy Commissioner (DC) Lodhran nominated LPP as third party to monitor plantation in Government Departments, District Lodhran and LPP monitored the plantation in Tehsil Dunya Pur & Tehsil Kehror Pakka. LPP Developed urban forest at Bahauddin Zakariya University-BZU and Miyawaki urban forest at Chak 100 M, growing 126000 saplings in Nursery, digging of lake at urban forest 100 M. LPP and Lucky Snacks Private limited jointly started the Spring plantation in Lodhran by planting 4000 saplings in 5 minutes to set an example for private sector to contribute towards Clean Green Pakistan.



Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) worked to foster the work on Violence Against Women (VAW) & marginalized, through awareness campaign and facilitating & referring victims to concerns and help them get justice. LPP Launch a district level 8-10 hours, toll free helpline for the victims of Lodhran District. It facilitated crisis and non-crisis intervention through referral to the appropriate departments/agencies. LPP capacitated the marginalized & bridging the gaps between victims & concerned stakeholders/institutions.




## Goal 13: Take urgent action to combat climate change and its impacts

Climate Change is widely considered as the biggest threat to global development. Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) believes that, without urgent action, climate change can severely undermine development and exacerbate the problem of poverty.

Active Citizen Digital Model (ADCM) brought the youth leaders together from local communities of Bahawalpur, Lodhran & Multan to undergo Active Citizen Program through digital/blended learning methodology. The Youth Leaders implemented Social Action Projects (SAPs), focusing on climate change in their communities, influenced Govt. stakeholders to prioritize climate action plans to play contributing role.

During the year 2021, LPP trained 259 active citizen volunteers, the youth groups, developed & implemented Social Actions Projects (SAP) focusing on thematic areas of climate change and Covid-19 pandemic prevention through awareness, SAPs and inspiring communities, line departments and other stakeholders in Districts Bahawalpur, Lodhran & Multan.



## Short Brief of Social Actions Projects (SAP)

- ✓ The members of the SAP prepared poster on climate change and used during door-to-door awareness campaign at Hassan Abad colony and Chowk Kumaharan Wala, Multan.

- ✓ Awareness on Reduction of Carbon use & Go Green, in which the SAP members raised awareness on the ways to reduce carbon footprints. They performed awareness sessions in the BZU university with different student groups.
- ✓ SAP members raised the awareness on climate change and cleaned the area with the help of community members in Sher Shah colony. They also conducted door to door awareness campaign for the adaptation of Green Technology. Under the SAPs, saplings were planted at Bahawalpur By-pass Road Multan.
- ✓ Active citizens of SAP raised awareness on climate change. They also prepared poster of climate change used during door-to-door awareness campaign in the area.
- ✓ Active Citizens raised awareness on how we can reduce our carbon footprints and methods to recycle wastes.
- ✓ Active citizens worked on solid waste management in DHQ Hospital Lodhran. After removing all the garbage & weeds from that ground, more than 200 saplings planted in the ground.
- ✓ Raising Alliance & youth, active citizens of SAP prepared artificial nests for birds with the waste material like plastic bottles, tins, shoe boxes, jute clothe and hanged those nests in 3 main public places of Lodhran (Urban Forest 100 Chak Lodhran, Canal View Park Lodhran, Bahaudin Zakriya University Sub-Campus Lodhran. Their main aim was to conserve the migratory birds of district Lodhran by providing them artificial homes after recycling waste material.
- ✓ Awareness Raising on unnecessary use of electricity & fossil fuels, active citizens of SAP raised awareness on unnecessary use of electricity & fossil fuels in different schools, colleges, & Motorway police. Saplings were planted in railway colony.
- ✓ Learned Group, active citizens worked on recycling of plastic waste material. They delivered sessions in three schools of Lodhran and raised awareness on how plastic waste is damaging our climate, while students were divided into groups and asked them to make different items of plastic like jeweler box, pencil box, plant hanging box & many things. Further, they hanged plants in plastic bottles at different walls of BZU campus from recycle plastic as well beautification of their campus & earth.
- ✓ Active citizens raised awareness on Climate Change in Gouheer Town Bahawalpur, they delivered door to door sessions on not to throw their home solid waste in streets rather to dump it in the dustbins installed by the BWMC. Moreover, they distributed more than 100 saplings in 25 houses & one school of Gouheer town. The members of SAP raised awareness on less use of plastic and importance of plantation and observed cleanliness day.
- ✓ The members of SAP recycled the waste material with the help of orphans in orphanage house and delivered sessions on climate change, decorated the orphanage wall.

### **Green & Clean Urban Forest**

- ✓ Distributed 46,610 plants in Spring season and 84,918 plants in Monsoon Season of 2021 in Lodhran with coordination of DC Lodhran.


## Goal 16. Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels

### LUC, Let Peace Prevail

Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) raised awareness and built capacity of Under-Represented Population Groups (UPGs) of minority, women and youth community members as an essential intervention in improving Local Governance service delivery in order to integrate their voices in identifying their issues and in decision making process at local and higher-level councils.



LPP Bridged the lacking of awareness and capacity building gaps among community members about newly introduced Punjab Local Government Acts-2019, Punjab Transparency and Right to information Act 2013, Baldia App, Gender Mainstreaming, Minority Rights, Gender Equality and Women Empowerment. It Developed Quality Training Manuals on Punjab Village Panchayat & Neighborhood Council Act, 2019 and Punjab Transparency and Right to Information Act, 2013. LPP capacitated 527 Under-Represented Population Group (UPG) members on Salient Features of Punjab Village Panchayat and Neighborhood Councils Act 2019, Punjab Transparency & RTI Act 2013, Baldia App, Gender Mainstreaming, Minority Rights, Leadership, and social skills.



LPP Strengthened the capacities of 18 Field Office Staff and 11 Implementing Partners Staff on Salient Features of Punjab Village Panchayat and Neighborhood Councils Act 2019, Functions of Field Offices, and Baldia App.



### Key Out Puts

#### **Trainings on Village Panchayat and Neighborhood Councils Act 2019**

- ✓ 527 Under-Represented Population Groups (UPG) members, 10 Field Office staff & 10 LPP field staff from Faisalabad & Lahore Districts were oriented on the newly introduced Punjab Local Government Act 2019 through 23 batches of online training workshops to play an effective role in the dissemination of information in their respective general community.

#### **Trainings on Punjab Transparency and Right to Information 2013**

- ✓ 237 Youth-UPG members (85 male, 156 female) were oriented on the Punjab Transparency and Right to Information Act 2013 through conduction of eight batches of training workshops including 10 Field Office Staff and 10 implementing partner field staff.
- ✓ 527 participants were oriented on the procedure to file an RTI request around Local Government services or other related public services.
- ✓ 237 trained youth-UPG members replicated the information in their communities.

#### **Orientation on Baldia App**

- ✓ 527 UPG members and 10 Field Office Staff were oriented on the Baldia App by The Punjab Local and Community Development Department in collaboration with Punjab Information Technology Board to digitally facilitate residents' requests for civil registrations, complaints and suggestions around Local Government services, through 23 batches of training with practical sessions for installation and usage of the application to help common citizens.

#### **Trainings on Gender Mainstreaming and Women Empowerment**

- ✓ 527 Under-Represented Population Groups (UPGs) were trained on the civil registrations (Birth, Death, Marriage & Divorce) through the Local Government staff

through 23 batches of training sessions for newly hired/deputed relevant Field Office staff members/Registration Clerks, LPP field staff along with UPG members (youth, minority & women) on the functions of Field Office and roles & responsibilities of Registration Clerks.

- ✓ These trained UPG members trickled down the information in their respective connected communities.

### **Orientation on Leadership and Social Skills**

- ✓ 527 UPG members were trained on leadership and social skills to tackle major socio-economic issues and convene the community sessions, facilitated meetings, developed community development plans, and approached their respective local councils and higher institutions to solicit support.

### **Trainings on Minority Rights**

- ✓ 527 minority, youth-UPG members & Field Office staff trainees were trained on minority rights and entitlements especially around Local Government Services in 16 batches of training workshops.
- ✓ These trained resource persons created awareness in their communities through community awareness sessions.

LPP capacitated 20 peace clubs (consisting of 400 students) and 50 faculty members in 02 universities around Counter Violence Extremisms (CVE) themes of social cohesion, critical thinking and leadership skills. Enhanced capacity of the targeted stakeholders to implement Counter Violence Extremisms centric activities at Azm-e-Pakistan (AeP) targeted campuses. LPP Increased targeted university's engagement on Counter Violence Extremisms initiatives on their campuses and Enhanced tolerance within and across communities. LPP contributed to the more inclusive, tolerant and peaceful Pakistan, with less exclusion and exploitation. LPP Promoted the rights of children, women, youth, and other marginalized groups, to strengthen their control over their own development focusing on Child Labor, Early/ Forced Marriage, Gender based Violence, Social Cohesion and Conflict Pre-emption.

## Few Learnt Lessons

### Skills for Market Linkages Round-2 (SFML-R2)

- ✓ Compatible program implementation & procurement planning and implementation can meet the tight deadlines & compliances, otherwise it may be a great loss (late procurement of tools & equipment, late establishment of training centers and cancelation of classes & one training center). Without class readiness, Request to Proceeds never should be submitted.
- ✓ Identification of Trainees as per criteria, signing of agreements/consent forms with parents & trainees must be adopted. Clear message of training duration & orientation of PSDF requirements decreases the occurrence of conflicts. Clear communication to the trainees, trainers, community resource persons, building owners & other stakeholders leads to the success, otherwise, there be a great dissatisfaction at both ends (Yaroo Khosa, Kot Mubarak, Jakhar Imam Shah (D. G. Khan), Malonai, Kamal Pur, Dialgarrh (Faisalabad).
- ✓ Working with PSDF, timeliness is very important. To meet the deadlines (Center establishment, Submission of Trainee's Profiles & Making the correction timely) are very critical. If the deadlines of Business Rules are not followed, a great financial loss may be occurred (Cancelation of 31 classes; rejection of one training center & two classes).
- ✓ Dealing with businesses, "beginning with the end mind", is the key of success, if the organization has its longer-term business planning.
- ✓ The combination of relevant experienced staff & the other sector's experienced staff can be compatible if intelligently managed in the case all staff was not relevantly experienced (only few staff members had the work experience with PSDF, but good team building got good results).
- ✓ In Commercial Tailoring, Hand Embroidery & Ada work there lies a great potential of business, especially in Faisalabad. However, relevant business experience, background & bearing of investment cost are required.
- ✓ Regular Monitoring, Meetings & Action Tracking with strong follows are useful tools to meet compliances.

### Active Citizen Digital Model (ACDM)

- ✓ During project implementation, LPP realized the importance of exposure visits for trained youth. These exposure visits could be helpful for youth to plan and design SAPs in a more effective ways by incorporating their learning from the best practices.
- ✓ This was felt the there is need to have more networking of youth from the different regions of Pakistan. Therefore, there may be a formal platform of all active citizens from all over Pakistan. This forum/ platform will not only build linkages & collaborations among the Active-Citizens but will also ensure the sustainability, sense of responsibility and ownership.
- ✓ There shall be some time allocated for the reflection of SAPs after the 50% completion of project activities. It will help implementing partner to review the progress of active

citizens and incorporate lesson learnt to improve the performance.

- ✓ There shall be an honorarium for volunteer facilitators, who almost engaged for more than a month in Active Citizen Project. LPP team has taken up this issue with the BC team and after getting their kind consent, the project budget has been revised and honorarium for the training facilitators provided.
- ✓ Lack of logistical budget for the SAPs was another learning, we believe there shall be a nominal amount for the logistic arrangements of the SAPs and Active Citizens should use that amount for implementation, whilst community shall also be motivated to add 50% community sharing. It will raise the sense of ownership of both Active Citizens and communities.
- ✓ At the end of project, active youth should be organized into some formal structure or network with the support of social welfare department for continuity of SAP concept therefore, LPP provides the opportunity to active citizens to form active citizens network in community event and youth convention on 14th July 2021.

## Voices of People

LPP Hygiene Promoters team prepared a set of information to educate school staff and students through regular hygiene sessions regarding COVID-19, common symptoms of COVID-19, spread & prevention of COVID-19. These sessions helped to address the myths and misconception. Regular hygiene sessions during school's assembly and classrooms ensured the adherence of SOPs regarding COVID-19. Schools in target communities adopted integrated cleaning practices into the daily plan and the LPP's campaign has established a culture of handwashing, hygienic practices among all.

***“Devastating to stay away from school, my classroom and friends. I was excited but confused and frightened at the same time. It was overwhelming to be back to school and it was a surprise to see double handwashing stations at the entrance of school gate. We were making a queue and our teachers and LPP Hygiene Promoters were measuring our distance at the entrance. LPP team demonstrated how to wash hands with soap and follow the new school rules during COVID-19. I shared recommended hygiene practices and my learning with my siblings at home. I wore mask and wash my hands with soap because I want my school to remain open”***, Zainab, an 8<sup>th</sup> grader at Government Girls High School (GGHS) Nawabpur, Multan shared while sharing her experiences after opening schools.



The Head Teacher of GGHS Nawabpur while sharing her experiences remarked as ***“Teaching in the times of coronavirus was a difficult and also challenging one. Reopening of the school and keeping every child safe was a great responsibility. Cooperation from LPP and UNICEF was a great help in these timing. Both parents and children are happy to know that the school premises were disinfected and handwashing facility with water and soap. To emphasize children and teachers on following the new set of rules was a challenging task which materialized with the support of LPP team. After installation of a handwashing facility, I saw enthusiasm and readiness among school staff and children to follow recommended COVID SOPs.”***



An eleven years' young girl Sawera Batool is one of the "Little Doctor" of her school, "Al-Yousaf Memorial School", Pahar Pur, the village of field Office Kot Murad, Tehsil 18-Hazari, District Jhang. The self-motivated, energetic & active Sawera Batool studies in 7<sup>th</sup> class. The journey begun when the Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) team approached to the Al-Yousaf Memorial School & identified Ms. Sawera Batool as the member of her School WASH Club. **"I will be the Little Doctor"**, she showed her interest as LPP team oriented the identified students about the role of School WASH Clubs and its sub groups, "Little Doctor", "School WASH Ambassador" & "School WASH Engineer". Leading the group of children not only at her school but in her village as well, she motivates & trigger them to keep their uniforms & dress clean, keep the teeth brushed, hair combed, nail cut & clean, avoid open defecation, use the latrines, wash hands before eating & after use of latrines. She not only contributed in developing their school action plans but ensures its implementation at best of her efforts with in school.



Nasreen Bibi, 52-year-old resident of village Wasoo Astana of Tehsil 18 Hazari in Jhang decided to discontinued the practices open defecation when LPP project aware and oriented then about health risks and other social hazards associated with open defecation. While explaining about the whole story she remarked as **"LPP female social mobilizer visited and met my four daughters and convinced them for latrine construction instead of going in open fields. Then my daughters talked with me, it was the first time that they asked for latrine and it was the motivation of LPP staff that my daughters got the confidence and then even ask their elder brother. Initially I was not convinced but latter on I convinced when my elder daughters shared about risks and other protection issues."**

She further added that along with other poor families of the area we also received material support which include pipe, Water Closet (WC) and P-trap but that was not enough as she had not resources to meet the expense of cement, bricks and cost of skilled and unskilled labor. Nasreen decided to get Rs: 7000 loans from her neighbors and built a low-cost latrine. Which she returned back in installments of Rs: 500 per month

**"Now my daughters feel comfortable as they now free of anxious and worries which they faced while going in open fields for defecation but never discussed with me due shyness. Thanks to LPP project team who has given confidence to my daughters and they spoke up for their rights and eventually LPP team supported us with component sharing"**



It is pertinent to mentioned here that total 200 poor HHs were provided support of component sharing for low-cost latrine construction and 28 were Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP)

women headed HHs and they constructed latrines and abounded the practice of open defecation.

### **Shumaila Bibi and Zoya Naveed gave-up child labor and enrolled back in school**

Shumaila Bibi D/O Muhammad Siraj is 10 years old. She is a resident of Ghareeb Abad (Jallah Arian), tehsil Dunya Pur. She belongs to a poor family. Her parents work as laborer in agriculture lands to fulfil their domestic needs. Shumaila also worked in the agriculture fields with her mother. Under Aawaz-II program, some members of the village forum compiled a list of children involved in child labor, where name Shumaila was also in that list as she accompanied her mother in field crops. For community action plan materialization, Village forum members met with Shumaila's parents along with some local influential and they tried to persuaded Shumaila and her parents to send her back to school. They also sensitized her parents about the disadvantages of child labor and the importance of education and highlighted the effects of child labor on children growth & health. Shumaila father expressed his feelings as.

***“Initially they were reluctant to send Shumaila back to school but latter on her parents agreed to enroll her in school. Aawaz-II team and Village Forum members met with the school principal and requested him to enroll her in school again. The principal enrolled Shumaila in school with this surety that she will not drop out again. Now Shumaila goes to school daily instead of working as child labor in filed crops We are happy and many thankful to LPP”.***

### **Zoya Naveed (child labour)**

Zoya Naveed D/O Rana Naveed is the resident of Nalay Wala, Tehsil Kehrur Pacca, District Lodhran. She is 9 years old. Zoya Naveed was studied in class one before COVID-19. However, when school closed due to COVID 19, she started working with her mother in field crops as laborer. Rana Abid (VF focal person) sensitized to Rana Naveed (Zoya's father) about the hazards & implication of child labor and importance of girl's education. After the strong mobilization Rana Naveed agreed to enroll his daughter in school again.

Zoya Naveed back to school after strong mobilization of VF members with her parents



Rana Abid met with school's principal along with Rana Naveed and enrolled Zoya Bibi in school. Now Zoya Bibi is very happy and thankful to AAWAZ-II program. Zoya expressed her emotions

***“It was very heartbreaking for me to see my friends and fellows go to school and most unappetizing things was I have to work hard for day long. I am very thankful to my parents for supporting me to go back to school. And many thanks to village forum and LPP team they bring to me back to school”.***

**Saeed Akhtar as a Special person facilitating other PWDs in registration** AAWAZ-II fields' teams recently distributed Referral directory in his village and also distributed RD to two PWDs (Azra Bibi D/O Muhammad Madni from Basti Dhalai and Rajab Ali from Iqbal Colony). Muhaamd Madni (Azra's father) and Rajab Ali coordinated with Saeed Akhtar about the procedure for obtaining disability certificate from social welfare department. He facilitated them about the process. Now both PWDs got the certificate form social welfare. Now they are grateful to AAWAZ II program and Saeed Akhtar for their tireless efforts in obtaining the certificates. They commented for LPP as

***"It was very first time that people at village level were shared the contact number of Govt. departments and supported too for seeking due support from District Govt. with the referral and coordination between LPP, village, Tehsil and District forum established by the LPP were able to get our disability certificates".***

LPP trained 250 students and faculty members on critical thinking after these trainings feedback of faculty was much encouraging. After the 3 month of completion the project Lett Peace Prevail LPP I. Chief executive officer CEO Dr. Muhammad Abdil Saboor received a letter from the department of political science BZU. In this letter Chairman of political Science department shared that department has started weekend master program on critical thinking. And he also requested to collaborate with the department regarding uplift the program through different activities offering scholar ships to the deserving students, organizing workshops and conferences on peace to counter terrorism, extremism and violence. It is great achievement of the projects implemented by LPP with Bahaudin Zakria University. This will contribute in countering terrorism extremism and violence at broader level.

***"It was actually practically implemented approach it is the need of time to learn critical thinking that enables you to think independently"*** Prof. Doctor Muqarrab Akbar HoD Political department BZU.

"Today I can proudly say that the beauty of our hard work reflecting now. The designed bouquet is shown today by this arranged session by these young talented people. We will make sure that LPP, BZU and IUB will continue its efforts for the betterment of students" Dr. Muhammad Abdil Saboor CEO LPP

These trainings have started thinking process in students mind they started accepting diversity and recognizing vulnerabilities of different peoples like transgender disables and minorities. Member of students' peace club from agriculture department along with his fellows did a



remarkable deed. He with his friends took steps which was immensely appreciated by the community in the surrounding. He went to transgender living areas and visited minorities to create harmony. Students' peace club members sit and have dinner with transgender and minorities discuss their daily routine particularly in the days of COVID 19. They shared that they are much depressed along with this they shared their problems of daily life as they are treated and discriminated by the people. Muhammad Talha Member of the student peace club mobilized some other fellows and went to transgender living close to their residence. He presented a gift to transgender as well. On this acceptance transgender Asmara paid thanks to peace club member and his fellows. Nadia Said ***"I am very happy and thankful to students' peace club member he came here sit with us presented a gift, it is very first time that we are heard, honored and have a chance to sit equal to with other community members we are transgender are never loved and respected by our family members also. We always feel missing someone who come and sit with us we feel missing our parents. We feel missing playing with our brother and sisters but whenever someone come to us and treat humbly with us it compensates our feelings for our near and dears"***.





This time I also face/hear some odd remarks from some of my friends and family members but I ignore these remarks and go forward and I originate"***.
