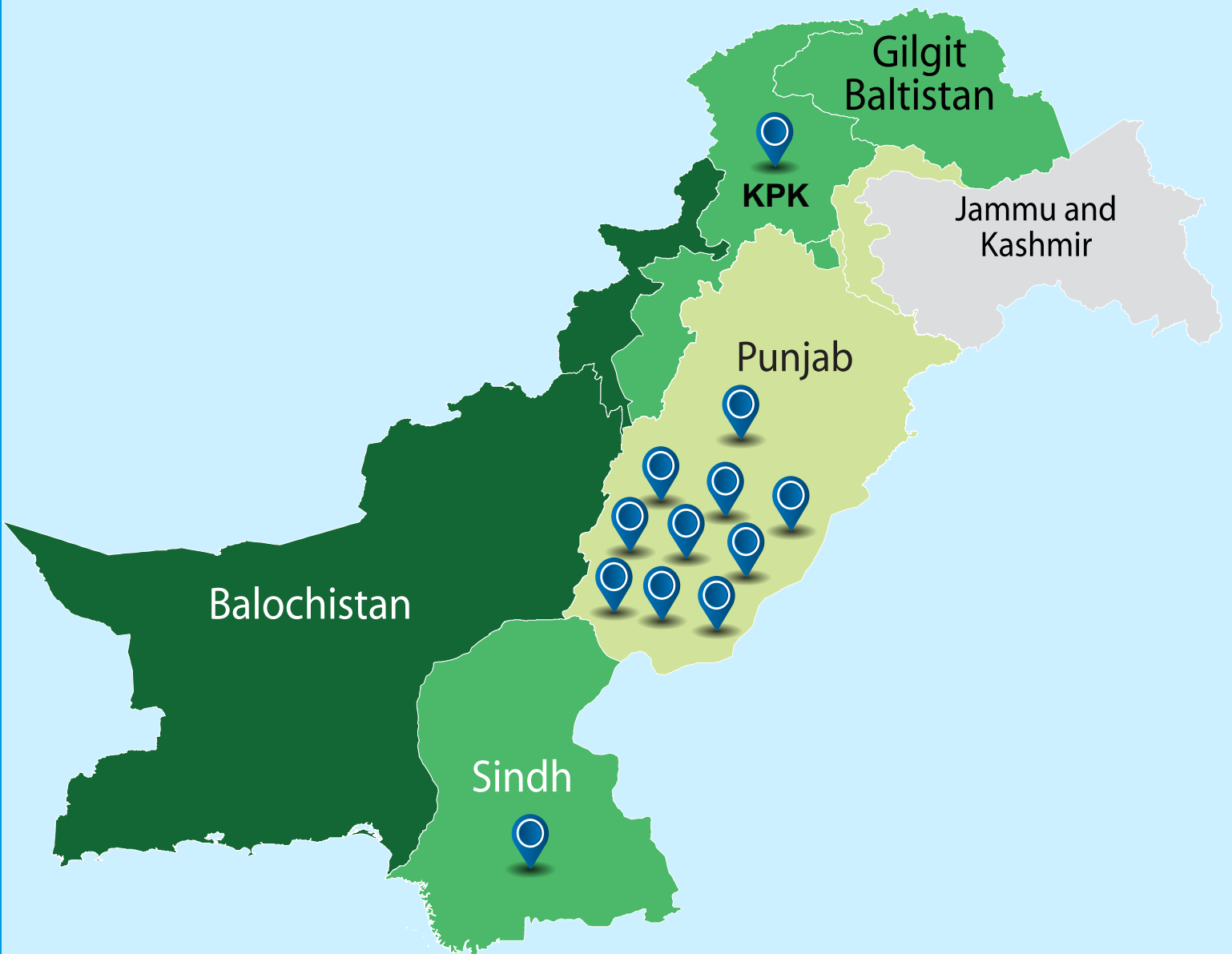

Flood Response

Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) remains focused on the provision of assistance during emergencies. During this year, Pakistan faced catastrophic flood all in most of districts. Several districts of Southern Punjab badly affected by devastating flood. People lost their lives, livelihood and infrastructure along with cotton that is ready for harvest, fodder, agroforestry plants, and animal fatalities. In addition, without a source of income, individuals suffer from basic requirements like nutrition and shelter. Realizing the intensity of the natural disaster, LPP immediately started Humanitarian assistance in in District Rajanpur, Dera Ghazi Khan and Rahim Yar Khan in mid-August through LPP CSR and donor support.

During the emergency response, LPP has divided the assistance in to three categories

- Early Recovery



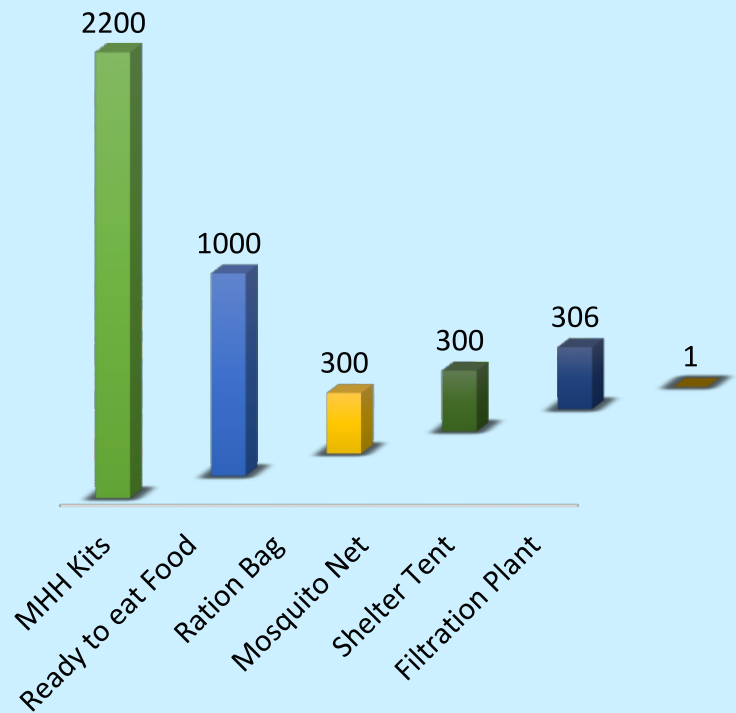

Water, Sanitation & Hygiene LPP Self Initiatives

LPP always encourages self initiatives for the people belonging from rural communities to create sense of ownership and sustainability. In this regard, LPP has started Health & Sanitation program being implemented in District Lodhran. The purpose of the project is to ensure handy access of rural community to the safe drinking water and raise awareness from hazardous effects of water borne diseases and bring an improvement in their quality of life by using safe drinking water through campaigns on hygiene promotion in order to save them as well as sensitizing them for proper utilization of water and minimize the wastage of water. The primary objective of the sanitation project is to save the poor & vulnerable communities of Lodhran from preventable diseases caused by inadequate sanitation services. Moreover, to engender a hygienic behavior among the community that is conducive to the good health.

Key Achievement during 2022

- Two Reverse Osmosis water treatment Plants have been made functional
- 236 Water Filter Plants have been made functional through community support
- 43 nonfunctional handpumps have been made functional
- 14 Biogas plants are made functional
- Missing facilitates have been provided in 10 Schools
- Support has been provided to Punjab local government and designed rural sanitation schemes



Health

LPP contributes to the 3rd Sustainable Development goal by ensuring good health and well-being of all humans at all age. During pandemic COVID-19, the global population have been severally effected. In Pakistan, people have been suffered from deadly virus causing loss of precious lives. LPP has not only provided support during the pandemic but also assisted the local communities through various health initiatives including Free Eye Camps and Limb camps. Through self initiatives, LPP has organized free eye camps to treat patients suffering from diseases related to eyes. These free eye camps are being organized quarterly with the aim to reduce cataract cases among the vulnerable community. An annual limbs camp has also been conducted in which free prosthetic Lower Limbs have been provided to the physically challenged persons who have lost lower limbs in accident or in any other mishap.

Key Achievements during 2022

- Screening of 866 patients for IOL Surgery.
- 147 Patients have been benefited by IOL surgery
- Artificial limbs have been provided to 28 physically challenged persons





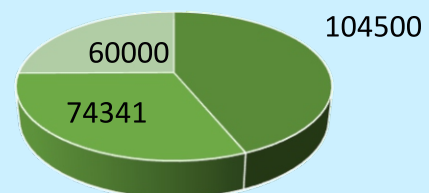
Climate Change & Environment

Climate change is a global concern affecting the overall environment of the world. Pakistan is most vulnerable to climate change due to its location on the equator. The people of the country facing severe challenges related to environment. In the past few decades, the country observed many catastrophes including floods, earthquake, rise in temperature and unusual rainfall. Similarly, smog is also creating miseries for the residents of metropolitans.

LPP believes without urgent action, climate change will severely undermine development and exacerbate the problem of poverty. LPP took concrete steps to mitigate this global issue by taking all possible measures for a clean, sustainable and environment friendly space for everyone. The Green & Clean Lodhran campaign has been launched in partnership with the district administration.

- 60,000 Tree plantation during clean & green campaign through ASWA project

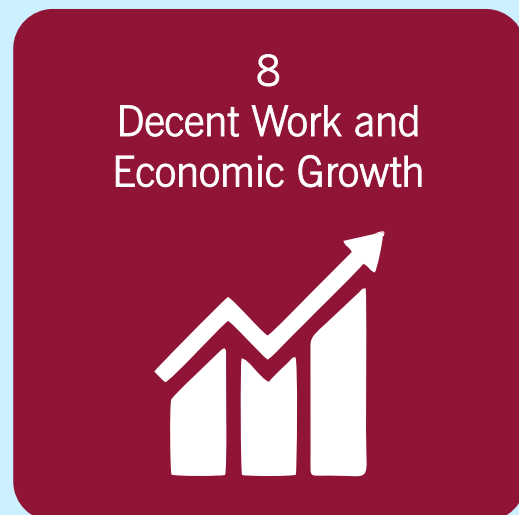

LPP has provided maximum support to the deserving families to improve their lives with better livelihood opportunities. In Pakistan particularly in the Southern Punjab, most of population have limited earning opportunities to look after larger families. Especially in rural areas, the head of a family is the only breadwinner for whole family. During this year, LPP has taken various initiatives to improve and sustain the livelihoods of marginalized families.

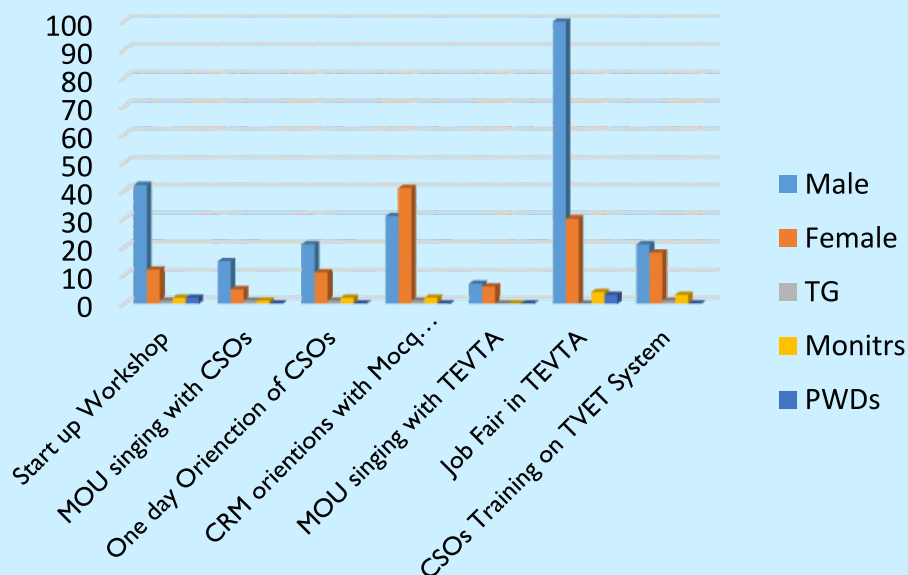

“Strengthening the socio-economic resilience of youth by promoting their economic self-reliance in Pakistan”

During the year 2022, LPP initiated a multi purpose project to strengthen economic condition of deserving families through the provision of technical education to the youth in three districts of southern Punjab (Bahawalpur, Rahim Yar Khan and Bahawalnagar). Overall objective of this initiative is to sustainably improve the socio-economic resilience of youth and their families so that they could be able to contribute for the well-being and better health of their families. This project also aims to enhance the capacities of Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) for their positive role in community development through livelihoods interventions. Furthermore, LPP has signed the MoU with TEVTA, COTHM and other private TSPs for the provision market oriented technical and vocational training to the deserving and marginalized youth.





Livelihoods

“Strengthening the socio-economic resilience of youth by promoting their economic self-reliance in Pakistan”

Key Achievements

- 10 most potential CSOs have been identified and MoU has been signed for capacity building and identification of youth for Technical & Vocational Training
- One-Day Orientation session for CSO members has been organized. Total 33 members of selected CSOs participated
- Session on Complaint Response Mechanism with mock exercise (CRM) at community level has been conducted to ensure the accountability. 73 community members attended the sessions
- 100 BBCM have been organized to mobilize 9,253 community members especially youth for Technical & Vocational Training
- MoU has been signed with TEVTA for the provision of Technical & Vocational training to the marginalized youth
- MoU has been signed with Jinnah Institute of Technology to train youth through variety of courses in the field of Information Technology, Freelancing.
- 3-Day Training sessions on TVET system for the 40 members of CSOs have been organized in three districts (Bahawalpur, Rahim Yar Khan, Bahawalnagar)
- A market study has been conducted through competent consultant to find out complete process of the needs of youth for skill development, current trend of youth, the labor market analysis and demand
- IEC material has been developed to disseminate at community level for information about the project and importance of technical education





Livelihoods

Koh-e- Suleman improvement Project (KSIP)

LPP has achieved another milestone in the provision of better livelihood for deserving communities from rural areas of DG Khan by initiating new project “Koh-e- Suleman Improvement Project” (KSIP). Main objective of this initiative was to increase the access of low income, poor and vulnerable members of society to vocational training and skills acquisition programs in Punjab so that they can earn higher incomes.

Basic theme of this project is to provide Technical and vocational trainings in the field of Livestock Management, Dress Designed and Basic Tailoring in Koh-e-Suleman Tehsil of Districts Dera Ghazi Khan. To facilitate the poor, LPP has established 09 training centers to train 400 marginalized youth who have demonstrable poor socio-economic conditions, Unemployed, Low Family Income and Zakat Eligible.

Key Achievements

- Community Resource Persons (CRPs) from targeted communities have been selected for ownership and sustainability
- 9 Training Centers (5 livestock management, 4 Dress designing and basic Tailoring) have been selected
- Training equipment has been provided at 9 training centers
- Community mobilization dialogue process has been adopted to finalize training venues and selection of focal persons and trainees
- 200 Trainees have been identified from marginalized communities and they have been enrolled for Livestock Management course
- MoU has been signed with the University of veterinary and animal sciences (UVAS) for assessment of trainees for livestock management trade



Livelihoods
Community Dairy Development Program (CDDP)

LPP emphasizes on the provision of possible assistance to vulnerable communities according to the local culture and resources.

In Pakistan, majority of rural population have been associated with livestock as their earning resources. In southern Punjab, due to lack opportunities, people from rural areas have no other option but to work as laborer for agricultural activities. People from local communities especially youth are much ambitious to start their own business but due to lack of resources and proper guidance, their dreams could not be fulfilled.

LPP has collaborative approach in provision of opportunities and initiated dairy development programs in rural areas to provide guidance and support for dairy development.

Key Achievements

- 09 farmers completed Fencing, untie their animals & provided free access to water
- 10 Farmer Discussion Groups have been conducted in which 175 community members actively participated. During the sessions, farmers discussed in detail about Tree Activity, Animal Health (FMD & HS), Calf Rearing, Value Chain & Beef Value Chain Actors, Calculation of Gross Margin
- 12 Silage bales have been provided to farmers



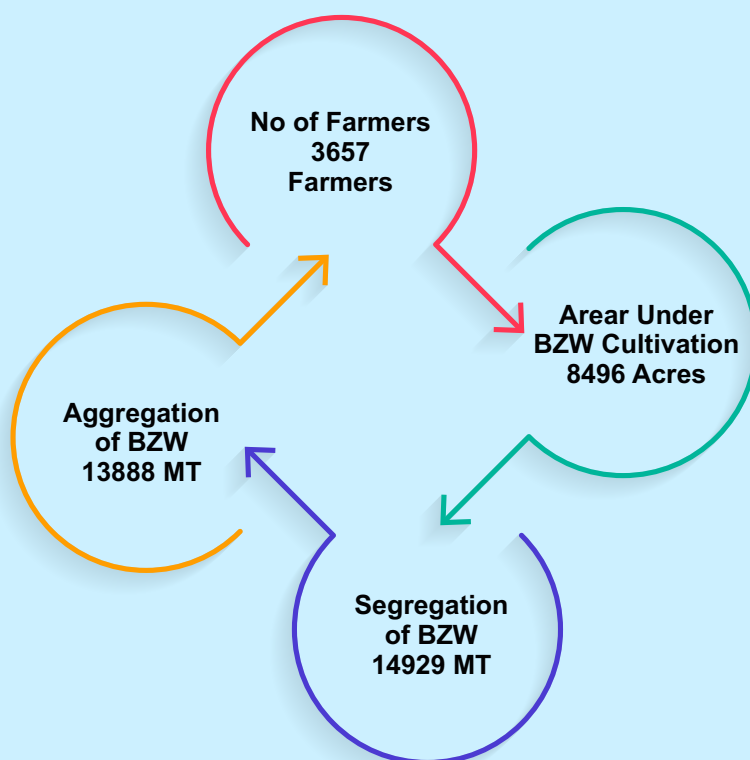
Food Security Commercialization of Biofortified Crops

Food security is one of the most alarming issue around the globe due to sudden climate change. In Pakistan, majority of population is facing insufficiency of affordable nutritious food effecting the health and economic condition in the country.

Zinc deficiency in the diet is globally hitting the lives of 17% of the world's population, and causing an increase in socio-economic encumbrance across developing under-developed countries. As a conclusion of profound indications and studies, it is imperative to cope with the zinc deficiency in daily diet. To serve this purpose, analysts suggest that bio-fortification can be a cost-effective, viable and sustainable approach to combat zinc insufficiency.

Biofortification of wheat can be a corridor to combat the stunted growth and mal-nutrition worldwide.

LPP is committed to provide maximum support to marginalized communities to improve their health through various initiatives. Realizing the intensity of issue, LPP initiated "Commercialization of Biofortified Crops" Project with the financial assistance of GAIN to cope with zinc deficiency issue in the country especially focusing the marginalized community of Southern Punjab.





Food Security Commercialization of Biofortified Crops

Key Achievements

Potential Wheat growing areas (9 UCs) of Multan district has been identified based on geographical proximity. Total No of identified Progressive and Semi Subsistence farmers in district Multan were 3657.

More than 100 Coordination meetings with Potential farmers were conducted regularly to arrange awareness and on-farm training sessions about Biofortified Wheat in each union councils

9 awareness raising seminars and 58 on farm training sessions were conducted in each Union Council of Multan.

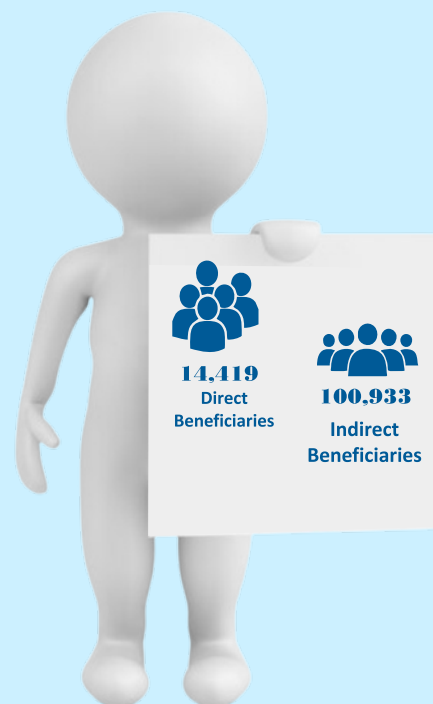
Project team has conducted awareness sessions with all Value Chain Actors (Farmers, Aggregators, Millars, Beoparies, Seed Retailers, Punjab Food Department etc.).

10000 Wheat Bags were also distributed among aggregators and Farmers for Segregation of Biofortified Wheat. Weighing machines, Bag Closer Machines and around 16000 flour bags have been distributed among identified aggregators and atta chakkies for the commercialization of biofortified flour.



“Support to national capacity building to realize Girl's Right to Education in Punjab”

LPP considers education as most important element for human development. In Pakistan, education sector is facing challenges for delivering quality education to the children. Unfortunately, the number of out-of-school children is much high due to socio-cultural barriers, non availability of facilities and lack of resources. Situation for Girls education is more alarming due to social taboos and unawareness about the importance of education. Majority of girls particularly in rural areas of the southern Punjab do not have access to schools even at primary level. Realizing the situation, LPP initiated “Support to national capacity building to realize Girl's Right to Education in Punjab and Gilgit-Baltistan” project in District Muzaffargarh with the aim to support the efforts of the Government of Punjab to increase access, retention, and improve the quality of girls’ education through capacity building and targeted interventions at both institutional and community levels.

Key Achievements

- 232 Co-signatories of formed SMCs have been trained on the roles and responsibilities of SMC
- 118 head teachers have been trained on the preparation of the School Development Plan, Management, and Leadership Skills
- 10 teachers of established Non-Formal Basic Education (NFBE) Centers trained on Management and Leadership Skills
- 14 Girls' School Enrolment Campaigns have been conducted
- 980 Community Members including 511 women participated in Girls' School Enrollment Campaigns
- Revitalized 118 Mother, Father Support Groups (MFSGs)
- 10 NFBE Centers have been established and equipped with learning material to support the learning of 389 enrolled learners including 339 girls

Making Students societies and clubs sustainable through CSR partnerships

Peace and Harmony plays vital role to develop strong social system where every person can live according to his believes despite of any religion, cast and race. In Pakistan, there is dire need to promote peace and harmony at grassroots level to create harmonized society.

LPP strongly encourages the promotion of peace especially among the youth. Realizing the importance of social harmony in multi-cultural society, LPP has executed several initiatives for youth at Institute and community level.

During 2022, “Making Students societies and clubs sustainable through CSR partnerships” project has been launched with the financial assistance of DAI. Main objective of this grant was to form sustainable peace clubs and students societies at universities (University of Karachi and Bahaudin Zakariya University, Multan)

Key Achievements

- 2-Day Refresher workshop on CVE has been organized. Total 171 students including 89 women have been trained
- Two-Day advanced workshop on Sustainability of Peace Clubs and Student Societies have been organized and 217 students including 123 women and 85 men 01 transgender and 8 People with Disability have attended the workshop
- 730 participants trained on social cohesion, acceptance and diversity including 292 men and 438 women
- 518 participants have been engaged in CSR funded SAPs including 361 women and 157 men
- 209 participants participated in EXPO in Multan out of which 31 participants were from university of Karachi



Women Peace Conference 2022

During the year 2022, LPP has achieved another milestone related to Peace and women empowerment. LPP has organized Women Conference for Peace in collaboration with DAI.

Key Achievements

- 10 Consultative Meetings have been held in Multan, Bahawalpur, Lahore and Karachi. 125 participants attended the meetings
- Cross Regional Women Cricket Match has been organized at Qaddafi Stadium Lahore in which 240 women participated
- Women Peace Poetry Event has been organized in Lahore. Total 143 women participated in the event
- Women Conference for Peace has been organized in Lahore and 283 women participated in the conference

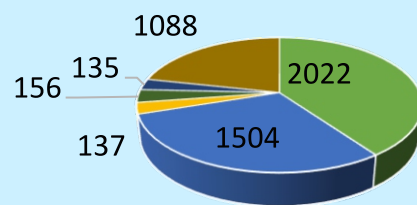


“CSO’s Building Resilience through Improved Delivery Governance & Empowerment Program (The CSO’s BRIDGE Program)”

Through this program, LPP foresees CSOs to be enabled to act as a bridge between local authorities and gender sensitive target groups (Youth, PWDs, women, transgender) to improve social services and thus minimize socio-economic vulnerabilities of the target groups resulting from outbreak of COVID-19 in selected informal sectors of Bahawalpur.

Sustainable communities, Capacity Building & Inclusion
 “AAWAZ II Program”

LPP has executed another program to for the promotion of human rights in Southern Punjab.

Aawaz II program is being implemented to promote the rights of children, women, youth, and other marginalized groups, to strengthen their control over their own development.

The program has been working through community based downstream partners, developing sustainable community fora that augment and strengthen the voice of the marginalized groups of communities. The communities have been provided safe spaces and access to referrals and information through Aawaz Agahi Centers (AACs) and further through community Agahi centers (CACs). The transformative effect of increased awareness and information, and the provision of training, support and linkages have been resulted in a sustainable change within communities.

Key Achievements

- 06 community Agahi centers have been established
- Referral Directory has been updated, printed and distributed to 3,405 individuals
- 47 conflicts have been resolved through dialogues in collective community action plan which benefitted 1546 individuals
- 133 Citizen engagement between community and services providers have been held
- IEC material disseminated among 28,963 community members
- 50 SAPs have been implemented by trained ACAs in their respective communities. Total 1296 community members have been directly benefitted from these SAPs
- An interfaith exposure visit has been organized for interfaith harmony at local level
- 04 District forum meetings have been conducted
- 04 meetings of District child rights alliance established by AAWAZ II have been held
- 184 children have got their Birth Certificates through 11 birth registration Campaigns



Accountability and Learning

LPP always focuses on accountability at every stage of project implementation. LPP ensures project interventions appropriate and have been designed in a way which positively contribute for the lives of communities and their empowerment.

To abide by this commitment, MEAL Unit has developed a strong Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability & Learning (MEAL) system under the direct supervision of Chief Executive Officer to improve the quality of interventions, providing timely information to project/program staff and senior management to make critical and strategic decisions for the improvement of interventions at any stage.

MEAL unit assisted in the overall development of the organizational annual objective of LPP, followed by assisting all projects and departments in developing their own in line with the organizational objectives.

MEAL unit has prepared and shared updated progress through Monitoring Action Trackers and DIP analysis on a monthly basis to keep the project on track and to ensure project wise and management decision compliance. MEAL proposed an automation system for the organization and the MEAL unit, taking into account the importance of data storage, management, and effective utilization across projects.

To ensure accountability to beneficiaries, an already established complaints and feedback mechanism was strengthened in order to carry it out and provide beneficiaries and stakeholders with the right to be heard. Transparency and accountability are central LPP values. In response to these commitments, the MEAL Unit conducted Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability, and Learning sessions in the community and among staff, as well as sessions on the LPP's Complaints Response Mechanism (CRM).
