## 1.2. Message from the President A Legacy Rooted in Passion

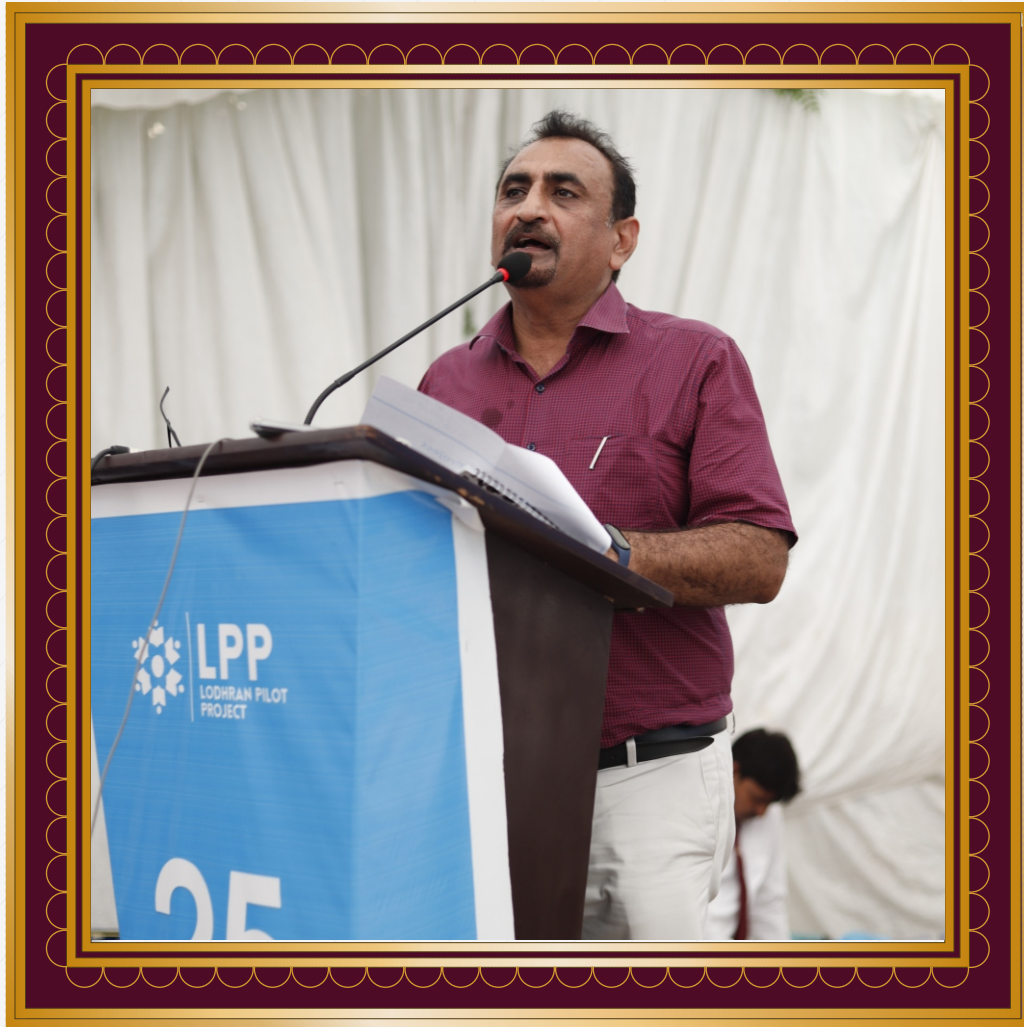

The Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) is a distinguished non-profit organization in Pakistan, committed to promoting development and humanitarian objectives since 1999. Registered under the Societies Act 1860 and certified by the Pakistan Center for Philanthropy, LPP has a history of empowering communities through various programs and partnerships.

With a focus on Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) initiatives, LPP aims to alleviate poverty, hunger, disease, and inequality in underprivileged communities in South Punjab. Inspired by Akhtar Hameed Khan and the Orangi Pilot Project, LPP's mission is to empower individuals and communities towards sustainable development through transparent, inclusive, and accountable processes.

With a focus on Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) initiatives, LPP aims to alleviate poverty, hunger, disease, and inequality in underprivileged communities in South Punjab. 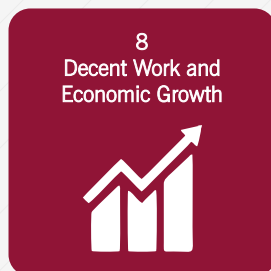
In 2024, the Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) celebrated 25 years of unwavering commitment to community empowerment and sustainable development in Pakistan. Marking its Silver Jubilee, LPP expanded its geographic reach and thematic programs, benefiting over 4.2 million individuals across 12 districts in Punjab, Sindh, and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Through targeted interventions in livelihoods, healthcare, education, WASH, climate action, and gender equity, LPP continued its mission of uplifting marginalized communities. Notable milestones included the vocational training of over 4,300 youth, the planting of 68,800 trees and achieved milestone of 600,000 plants in 2024, the establishment of RO water filtration plants, and specialized support services for women, transgender individuals, and persons with disabilities. These efforts reflect LPP's deeply rooted values of transparency, inclusivity, and dignity, as it continues to serve as a model for grassroots development in South Asia.

Overall, LPP's values of transparency, mutual respect, teamwork, and inclusivity drive its efforts to create a just society where individuals are empowered to lead the development process with dignity. Through a commitment to learning, professionalism, and community engagement, LPP continues to make a positive impact on the lives of those it serves.

# 4. Empowering Communities: LPP's Social Sector Achievements 2024

## 4.1. Technical & Vocational Skills Development

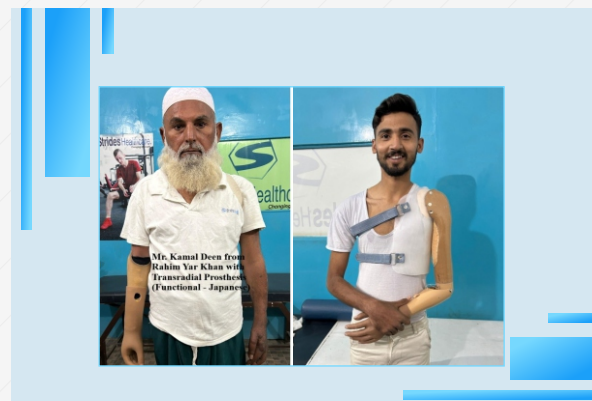
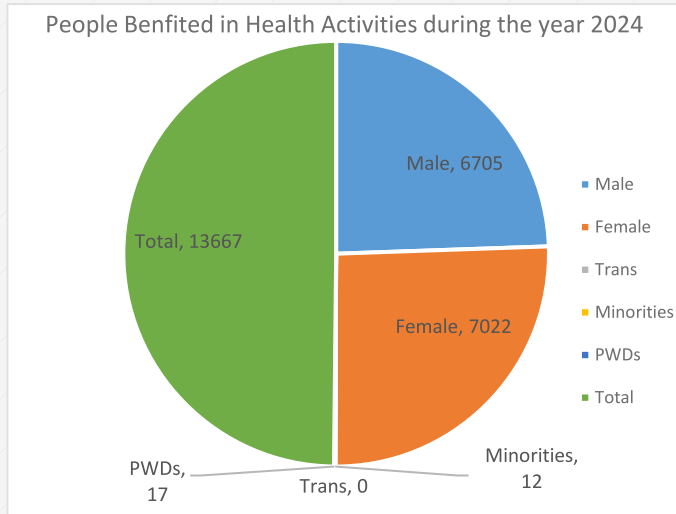


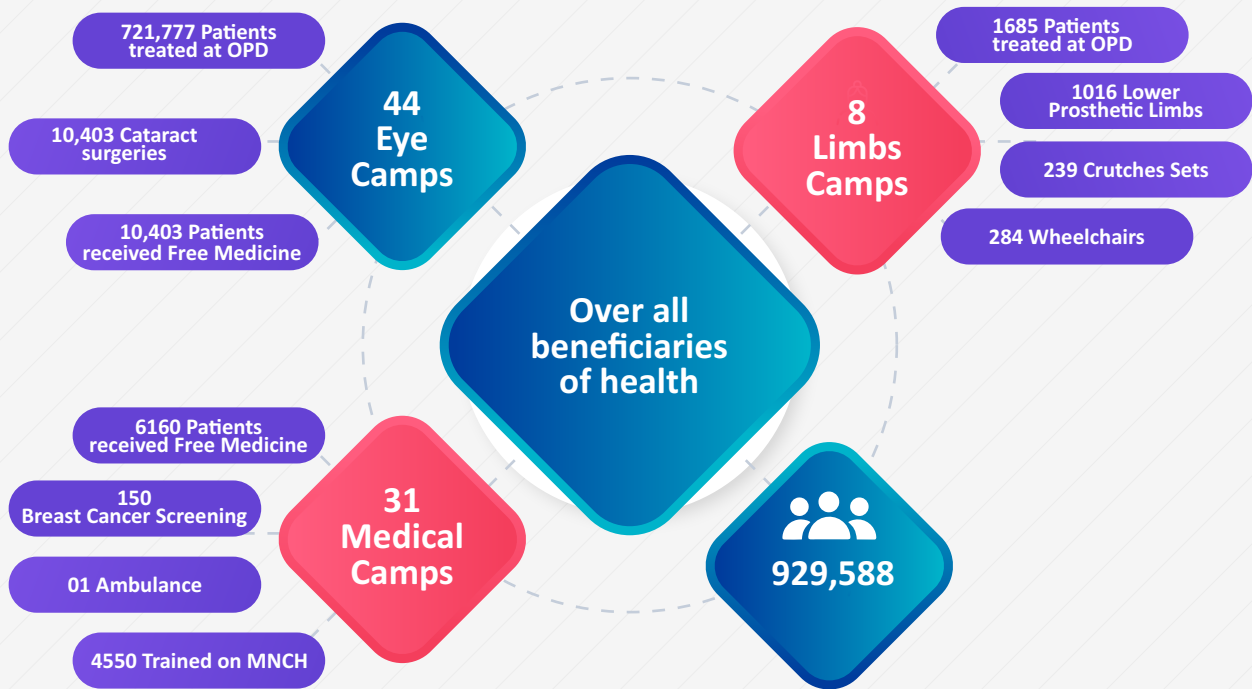


### Key Achievements:

Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) has significantly transformed the vocational and employment landscape of South Punjab by empowering over 4,300 youth through certified technical and vocational training programs in collaboration with TEVET and private institutes. Among them, 1,027 youth were further supported with customized toolkits and business plans, enabling them to launch micro-enterprises and drive local economic growth. LPP facilitated the job placement of 667 trained individuals across diverse sectors, while also creating specialized spaces for women through two advanced tailoring and dress design centers in Lodhran. The project bridged critical gaps in employability by offering inclusive, high-quality training programs across five public and private institutes affiliated with NAVTTC and TEVTA, ensuring access to standardized, industry-relevant education. With 336 youth placed in on-site traineeships and 43 guided through career counseling and value chain integration, LPP reinforced practical skill application and long-term income sustainability. Its strategic linkages with financial institutions and employers catalyzed business expansion and job access, while capacity building for 25 Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) strengthened local systems for youth empowerment. Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability, and Learning (MEAL) findings confirmed that over 90% of LPP-trained youth now earn above the national minimum wage—an achievement recognized as a sectoral milestone and a testament to LPP’s role in fostering economic resilience and inclusive development.

## 4.2. Health and Rehabilitation

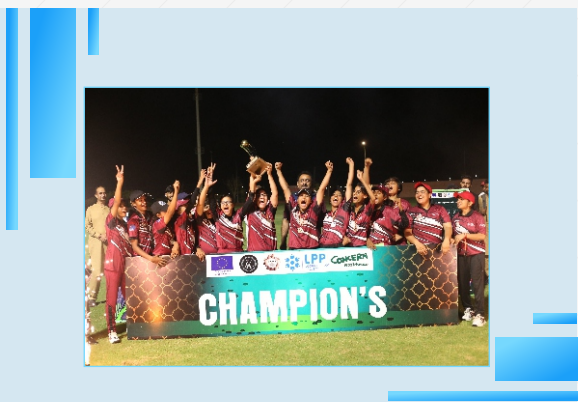
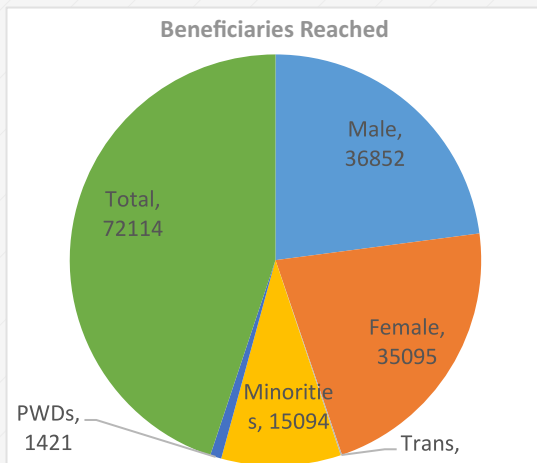




### Major Initiatives:

Through a series of impactful health interventions, Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) has significantly enhanced healthcare accessibility and awareness in underserved regions of South Punjab. By organizing free eye camps and lower limb rehabilitation clinics in Lodhran, LPP addressed critical healthcare needs of vulnerable populations, restoring mobility and improving quality of life for hundreds. The organization also took a proactive stance on women’s health by conducting breast cancer screening camps in both Lodhran and Multan, in partnership with government hospitals, facilitating early detection and preventive care. To overcome geographic barriers, mobile health vans were deployed to remote communities, delivering on-site medical consultations and basic healthcare services to those who previously lacked access. Complementing these efforts, LPP introduced ambulance services to provide timely emergency transportation and established referral pathways to specialized hospitals in Lahore and Multan for chronic patients requiring advanced treatment. Health and hygiene awareness sessions, coupled with the distribution of essential kits, further empowered communities to adopt preventive health practices. Collectively, these initiatives underscore LPP’s commitment to inclusive healthcare delivery and its role in strengthening the region’s public health infrastructure.

## 4.3. Gender Equality, Inclusion & Women Empowerment

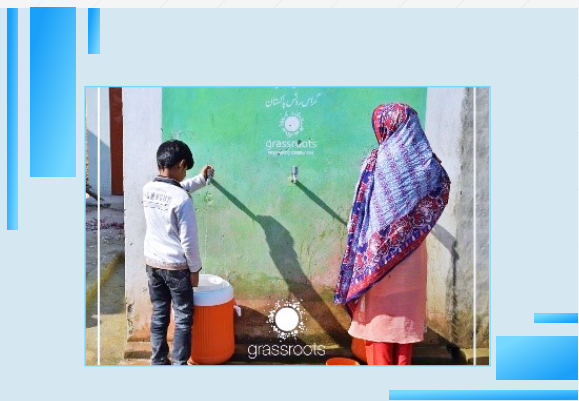
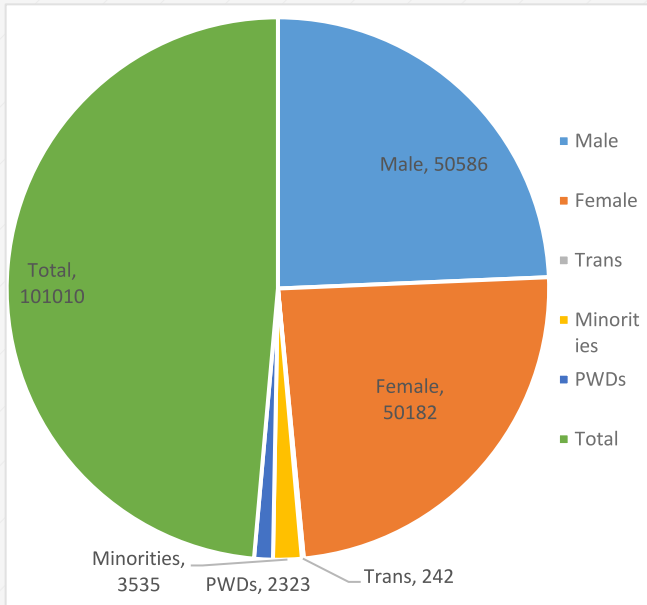


## Women Empowerment

Through pioneering programs by donor support and CSR such as Powered by Women, BRIDGE, AAWAZ II, Subh E Nau, and its Core Programme, the Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) has driven transformative change across Bahawalpur, Multan, Sahiwal, and Lodhran by challenging deep-rooted gender biases and fostering inclusive community development. LPP's initiatives have successfully shifted harmful societal mindsets around gender discrimination and exploitation, while simultaneously building the capacity of local and district forums to prevent violence and improve the responsiveness of essential services. A cornerstone of this work is the launch of a 24/7 helpline for women survivors of violence, offering integrated legal aid, psychosocial counseling, and rehabilitation services. Dedicated women's centers have been established to equip women with market-relevant skills in dress designing and tailoring, enhancing their economic independence. In a bold stride towards intersectional inclusion, LPP funded three CSOs representing minority, transgender, and differently-abled groups, and introduced honeybee farming as a sustainable livelihood option for the transgender community. By facilitating identity and civil registration through door-to-door partnerships with NADRA, the organization has empowered marginalized populations with legal recognition and access to services. Through seminars, workshops, Social Action Projects (SAPs), and targeted awareness campaigns—including tailored IEC materials and video content—LPP has amplified public discourse on gender justice, human rights, and peaceful coexistence, solidifying its role as a key driver of inclusive, rights-based development in South Punjab.



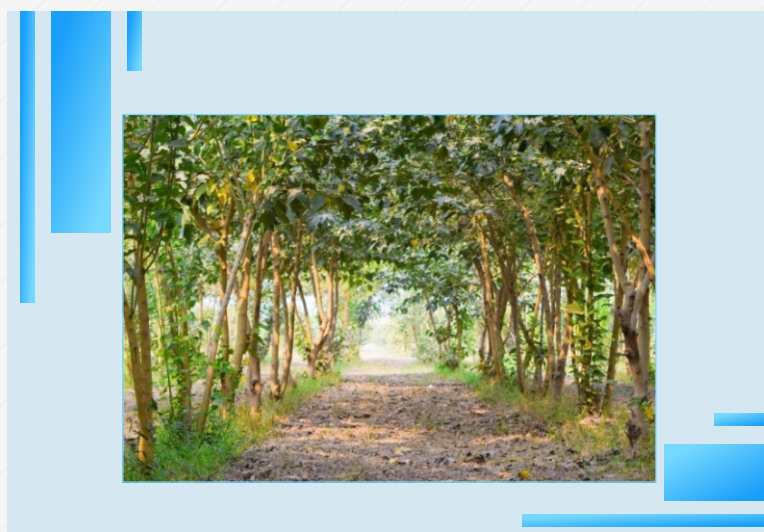
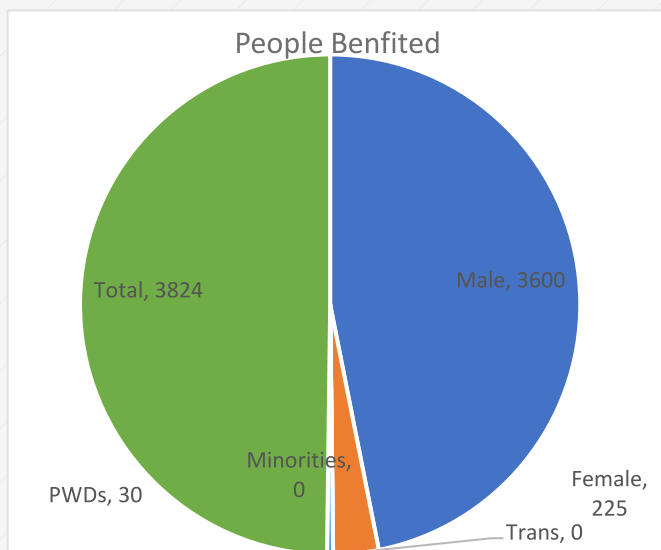
## 4.4. Water, Sanitation & Hygiene (WASH)





Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) has made remarkable strides in improving WASH standards across underserved regions of South Punjab. Through targeted initiatives under the Core Programme, BRIDGE, and flood response projects in Bahawalnagar and Layyah, LPP addressed both infrastructure needs and behavioral change. It installed and rehabilitated multiple Reverse Osmosis (RO) plants, ensuring access to clean drinking water in Lodhran, Rahim Yar Khan, Bahawalpur, and Multan. With a focus on sustainability, solarization of filtration plants and water schemes has reduced operational costs and environmental impact. Handwashing stations and WASH rooms were constructed in schools, reinforcing hygienic practices among students, while handpumps, waste bins, and garbage containers improved public sanitation. In response to disasters, water purification tablets and hygiene kits were distributed, supported by health awareness sessions and Village WASH Committees. The integration of local authorities in awareness campaigns and the dissemination of IEC materials during epidemics further positioned LPP as a critical player in sustainable WASH interventions.

## 4.5. Climate Smart Action

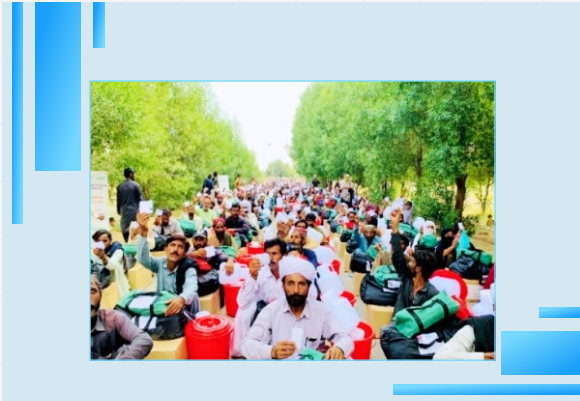
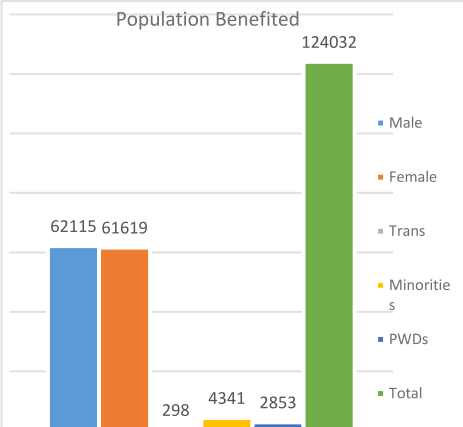




**Key Achievements:**

LPP's climate-smart interventions have reshaped the environmental landscape of South Punjab by embedding nature-based solutions into community planning. In collaboration with Islamia University Bahawalpur (IUB), LPP established a full-scale Miyawaki forest and maintained a 12-acre Urban Forest—an urban greening model that addresses rising urban heat and air pollution. Furthermore, five mini urban forests in schools and communities reinforced environmental education and youth engagement. The large-scale plantation of 68,800 mixed trees and the propagation of 80,000 saplings emphasized a proactive, regenerative approach to climate resilience. These efforts not only contributed to carbon sequestration but also laid the foundation for long-term ecological sustainability and environmental stewardship.

# 4.6. Disaster Risk Reduction & Management (DRR&M)



### Interventions:

Responding swiftly to the catastrophic floods in Layyah and Rajanpur, LPP’s humanitarian efforts under BRAVE and the Flood Response Project proved both timely and transformative. Over 3200 flood-affected families received vital Non-Food Items (NFIs), while others benefitted from emergency shelters, hygiene kits, and direct cash assistance. LPP’s gender-sensitive response supported 200 women in restarting livelihoods, showcasing an inclusive recovery strategy. Agricultural recovery was addressed through the provision of farming inputs to 1750 households, and 57 livestock vaccination campaigns protected rural economies. Beyond relief, LPP invested in long-term resilience by rehabilitating critical infrastructure such as irrigation channels, culverts, roads, and flood protection bunds—helping communities prepare for future disasters.

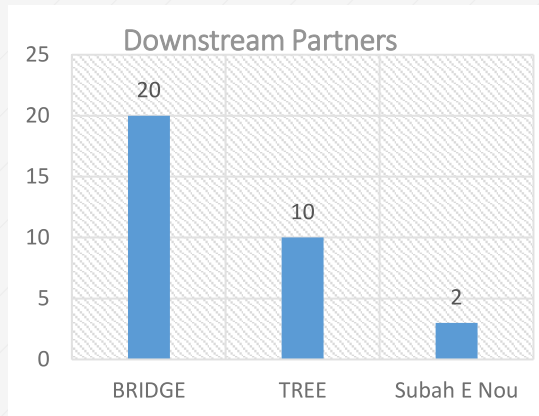


**Major Highlights:**

Infrastructure development has remained a central pillar of LPP’s mission to promote inclusive growth and improve public service delivery. Through the BRIDGE, TREE, and Core Programme initiatives, LPP introduced a range of community-driven infrastructure projects including solarized water supply schemes, bio-sand filtration plants, and improved sanitation systems. The organization constructed over 175 RCC culverts, 272 feet of sewerage lines, and upgraded water systems, while investing in socially inclusive designs such as ramps for persons with disabilities. By developing key public spaces like the Wajid Colony water scheme and a sitting area at the Kehror Pacca Police Station, LPP has not only enhanced access to services but also revitalized community trust in public infrastructure.

## 4.8. Governance & Institutional Development

LPP has strategically strengthened local governance through the BRIDGE, TREE, and Subh-e-Nou projects. By enhancing institutional transparency, community participation, and interface mechanisms between citizens and local authorities, LPP has fostered a culture of accountability and inclusive governance. These interventions have supported Union Councils and District bodies to better plan and deliver services—creating pathways for citizen feedback, participatory development, and policy influence.



## 4.9. Strengthening Civil Society for Sustainable Impact

Through its flagship projects—**TREE**, **BRIDGE**, and **BRAVE**—Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) partnered with **33 Civil Society Organizations (CSOs)** across South Punjab, enhancing their capacities in **financial management, project design, stakeholder engagement, monitoring & evaluation, and coordination.**

Under the **TREE project**, CSOs were trained on the **TVET system**, including exposure visits to TEVTA institutions in Punjab and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. Following capacity building, LPP provided grants to CSOs for implementing community-based projects in their respective districts.

- **10 CSOs** (3 from Rahim Yar Khan, 2 from Bahawalnagar, and 5 from Bahawalpur) implemented **TVET-focused interventions.**
- **2 CSOs** worked on initiatives addressing **Countering Violent Extremism (CVE).**

In the **BRIDGE project**, CSOs submitted proposals which, upon review and approval, received funding to implement diverse community interventions:

- **7 CSOs** addressed **WASH in schools** and access to **safe drinking water.**
- **3 CSOs** focused on **solid waste management.**
- **3 CSOs** provided **vocational training and skill development for women.**
- **2 CSOs** promoted **climate-smart agriculture and livestock development.**
- **1 CSO** implemented a project on **legal awareness.**

Further, under BRIDGE:

- CSOs were trained on **poverty scorecards** and **community scorecards** to improve local service delivery.
- **Interface dialogues** were facilitated between **community representatives** and **local authorities.**
- **20 CSOs** received refresher training on **project cycle management.**
- **Joint workshops, exposure visits,** and the development of **three-year Inclusive Union Council Development Plans** were conducted.
- **Four development schemes** proposed by CSOs were successfully integrated into **government budgets.**
- **18 community grants** were completed, contributing to meaningful **behavioral change.**
- A successful campaign was held for **16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence.**

Under the BRIDGE Project, the Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) strengthened the capacity of Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) through comprehensive trainings on Poverty Scorecards and Community Scorecards, aimed at enhancing community-driven service delivery. In addition, interface dialogues were facilitated between local authorities and community representatives to promote transparency and collaboration.

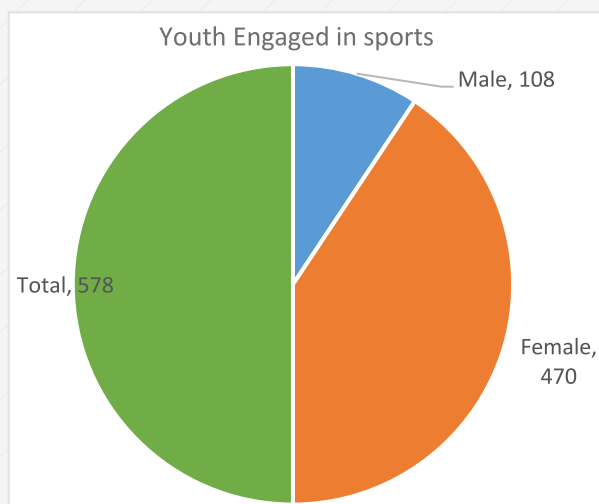
Regular coordination meetings were held with CSOs, Tehsil Action Groups (TAGs), and the District Civil Society Network (DCSN). As part of ongoing capacity building, 20 targeted CSOs received refresher trainings on Project Cycle Management. The initiative also included joint workshops, exposure visits, and the successful completion of a Community Scorecard exercise.

LPP maintained consistent engagement with District Local Authorities (LAs), supporting CSOs in the development of three-year Inclusive Union Council Development Plans. As a result, four development schemes were integrated into the official government budget, and 18 community grants were successfully implemented, fostering meaningful behavior change at the grassroots level.

- Facilitated **interface dialogues** with local authorities
- Supported **3-year Union Council Development Plans**
- **4 schemes** integrated into government budgets
- Celebrated **16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence**

## 4.10. Youth Engagement through Sports



- Youth from marginalized communities were trained
- Girls from Lodhran were selected in **national U-15 & U-19 teams**
- Hosted **South Punjab Cricket Tournament** featuring **transgender participation**—a first in Punjab
- Organized multiple **trials and talent hunts**



## 4.11. Community Dairy Development

Under Community Dairy Development Program (CDDP) 616 farmers in animal health, silage use, water access, and proper livestock management were trained. The program encouraged partnerships with the Livestock Department and corporate actors like Nestlé and Engro, fostering improved veterinary outreach and food security.

In 2024, Women Empowerment initiatives expanded under the Subh-e-Nau campaign, promoting gender equity and challenging violence against women and minorities. Dress-making centers trained dozens of women, while honeybee farming pilots created livelihood opportunities for transgender persons. These initiatives also supported minority and disability-focused CSOs. Events like International Women's Day, Christmas celebrations, and Disability Day fostered inclusion and harmony.

- **616 farmers** improve income via animal husbandry
- Promoted:
  - Safe water access for livestock
  - Age/group-based animal management
  - Timely dehorning, silage use, disease vaccination
  - Access to services via Livestock Department & corporate partners like **Engro, Nestlé**



# 5. Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability & Learning (MEAL)

Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) is committed to delivering impactful, community-centered interventions that foster empowerment and sustainable development. To uphold this commitment, LPP has established a robust Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability & Learning (MEAL) system designed to enhance the quality, effectiveness, and responsiveness of all projects and programs.

The MEAL Unit plays a pivotal role by providing timely, evidence-based insights to project teams and senior management, enabling informed, strategic decision-making throughout the project cycle. It ensures that interventions are not only effective but also adaptive to community needs. To strengthen transparency and accountability, LPP has instituted a comprehensive Complaints and Feedback Mechanism, reinforcing the right of beneficiaries and stakeholders to be heard, respected, and responded to. This mechanism empowers communities and fosters trust in LPP's work.

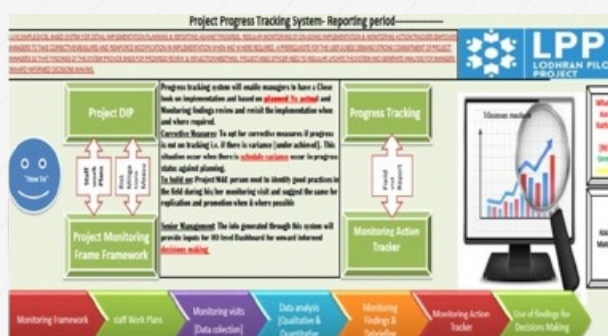
LPP's MEAL unit ensured quality, transparency, and evidence-based decision-making:

- Trained **130 staff** on tools and standards
- Produced **304 monitoring reports**, **12 MAT analyses**, **13 evaluations**, and **56 program meetings**
- Supported proposal development for **7 concept notes**
- Facilitated **refresher trainings** and **interface dialogues**
- Developed **Inclusive Union Council Plans** and supported **RAG-based reporting**

## 6. Voices of the People – Impact Stories



### Story 1:

#### Rebuilding Hope (Lal Mai's Journey from Loss to Livelihood)

In the wake of the devastating floods that struck Rajanpur, Punjab in 2024, countless families were left grappling with the aftermath—contaminated water, widespread disease, and complete disruption of daily life. Among the affected was Lal Mai, a resilient widow and mother of six, who had been struggling to make ends meet since her husband's death in 2000.

With limited income from her eldest son's daily wage labor, survival was a daily challenge—until help arrived. Under the “BRAVE – Humanitarian Assistance for Flood 2024 Affected Communities, Pakistan” project, Concern Worldwide and the Lodhran Pilot Project (LPP) reached her village and provided critical relief. Lal Mai and her family received essential Non-Food Items (NFIs), Health & Hygiene Kits, and Dignity Kits, helping restore a sense of dignity and safety.

Her story took a hopeful turn when she was selected for the Cash for Work scheme, earning PKR 20,000 for her role in rehabilitating the local water pond. This income allowed her to sow wheat on her land and cover essential household needs. Today, Lal Mai stands as a symbol of strength and perseverance—her determination, coupled with timely support, is helping her build a better future for her children.

### Story 2:

#### Breaking Barriers (Ayesha Khalid, The First Working Woman in Her Family)

Ayesha Khalid, a 23-year-old from Dera Izat village in Bahawalpur, defied the odds to become the first employed woman in her family. Coming from a background of financial hardship, Ayesha discovered a beacon of hope in LPP's free technical and vocational training program.

She enrolled in the Certificate in Computer Application (CCA) course, where she learned key digital skills and participated in career counseling sessions that built her confidence and employability.

With support from LPP—including mentoring, stipends, and job placement facilitation—Ayesha began her job search with newfound determination.

Her persistence paid off when she secured a position as a Key Punch Operator at Pak National Distributors (PND), a distributor of multinational products. She now works in the Unilever section, earning PKR 40,000 per month—a remarkable achievement that transformed her life. Today, Ayesha is not just supporting her family; she is an inspiration for other young women in her community to pursue technical education and carve their own paths to independence.

### Story 3:

#### **From Passion to Profession (Warda's Transformation Through Skill Training)**

In a small town where opportunities for women are scarce, Warda, a young woman with big dreams, saw her future begin to unfold the moment she joined the beautician training course offered by LPP in partnership with Concern Worldwide (CWW).

Through the six-month program, Warda gained hands-on skills in skincare, makeup, and salon management—alongside vital business training that helped her understand how to run a sustainable enterprise. Upon completing the course, she received a starter toolkit that became the foundation of her dream.

Warda soon launched her own beauty salon in her neighborhood. With growing word-of-mouth, her business began to flourish. Today, she earns PKR 10,000 to 15,000 per month, enough to support herself and contribute to her family's household expenses. Warda's journey from limited options to financial independence is a powerful story of how the right opportunity, when met with passion and determination, can change lives.



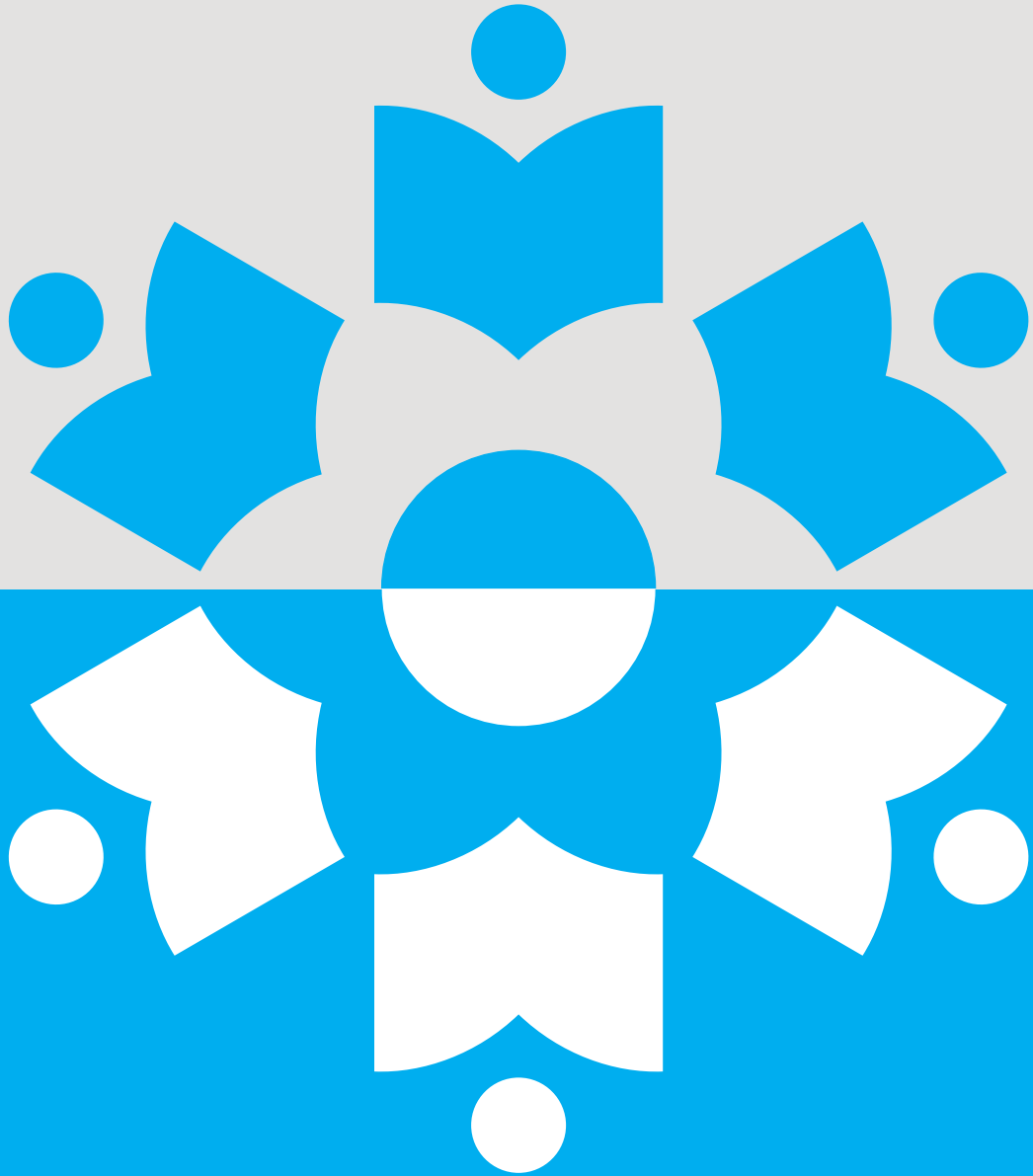
